- History and Geography: 2hrs in addition to the French HG classes; dealing with the anglophone vision (and version) of the historical time period imposed to compliment and complete the French HG program.

3eme History Geography

- 3eme History Program
- Theme 1: GB in World War I, Homefront, propaganda, study of primary source document replicas
- Theme 2: GB in World War II, Homefront, British resistance through the study of UK press articles
- Theme 3: Social changes in Britain since 1945

3eme History and Geography

- 3eme Geography Program:
- Theme 1: Territorial dynamics; The McDonald's Story; Euro Disney
- Theme 2: Territorial Development; Case study on territory promoting shared development

IGCSE Literature (0486)

- This section is divided into three parts:
- <u>Poetry and Prose</u>: a 1.5 hr exam to respond to two questions on the poetry and prose program studied in 3eme and 2nd; essay writing and commentary.
- <u>Drama</u>: a 45 min exam to respond to one question on the drama section of the program studied in 3eme and 2nd; essay writing and commentary.
- <u>Coursework Portfolio</u>: Two papers written by the students in 3eme and reviewed in 2nd; essay, commentary or empathic tasks.

Syllabus 0486 2018-2020

- Poetry: A selection of 15 poems from Songs of Ourselves
- Short Story: A selection of 10 short stories from Stories of Ourselves
- Prose: A Separate Peace, John Knowles; Cry, the Beloved Country, Alan Paton (optional: In Custody, Anita Desai)
- Drama: A Raisin in the Sun, Lorraine Hansberry; Romeo and Juliet, Shakespeare (optional: A View from the Bridge, Arthur Miller)

IGCSE First Language (0500)

- This program is 2hr a week and prepares the students for the following exams:
- Reading: 2hr exam; Reading unseen passages and responding to questions on content and use of language.
- Directed Writing: 2hr exam; Reading unseen passages and responding by doing skill based tasks (diary or letter writing, descriptive writing, creative writing, etc).

OIB Program 2016-2021

- Current 2nd program: a pre-OIB preparation course to allow students a year of immersion into the OIB program before starting the official program for 1ere/Ter. Internal assessment only training for essay writing, document based commentaries and 'croquis' in HG
- English: 6hrs that replaces the LV1 classes; 4hrs of literature; 2hrs of method and exam practice
- History/Geography: 2hrs in English and 2hrs in French to prepare students for the set OIB HG program focusing on American and GB case studies.

OIB Program 1ere/Ter

- Cycle 1ere et Ter is tested in Ter year with:
- 1 4 hr written test in LL and one 30 min oral, both test the whole two year program
- 1 4 hr written test in HG and one 15 min oral both in English only and on the Ter program only
- The coefficients depend on L, ES or S séries

OIB Program LL

- 1ere/Ter English Program: 6 Core texts for all OIB schools with the American Section; 3 in-depth texts for the oral exams
- The Tempest (core and in-depth)
- 3 works of prose (one core and one in-depth)
- 2 plays (one core)
- 3 works in translation (one core)
- 2 poets (one core and one in-depth)
- 2 works of non-fiction (one core)

OIB Program HG

- 1ere/Ter History Program:
- History: 5 Themes in 1ere and then 5 more in Ter based on US and World history from the mid 19th century; Focus of History and Memory
- Geography: 4 Themes in 1ere and 3 more in Ter based on Globalisation, Territories and their Growth; Understanding and using maps (croquis)
