LE COLLÈGE SÉVIGNÉ



Collège Sévigné, founded in 1880, was the first school to offer high-quality secondary education for girls. Led by the emblematic figure of Mathilde Salomon, its headmistress from 1883 to 1909, it participated in the secular and republican movements of the Third Republic. A pioneer in the field of education, it cultivated its tradition of humanism, excellence and open-mindedness.

True to this spirit, since 2015 Collège Sévigné has developed a multilingual education, from kindergarten through to the final year, terminale, seeking the well-being of children and teenagers.

This education aims to support students within a caring pedagogical framework.

In addition, openness to new technologies, at the heart of the transmission of knowledge, helps young people acquire autonomy from an early age.

Parents have a key role to play in this shared adventure. They are regularly informed:

- about their child's schooling, through the École Directe digital workspace,
- periodically, when they receive more general information on the life of the facility,
- by the Parents' Association (APE), which plays an important role at Sévigné.

The relationship of trust established between families and the school when their child is enrolled remains a precious foundation to which we pay close attention.



From Kindergarten to CM2

THE PEDAGOGICAL PROJECT AND EDUCATIONAL PROGRAM AT COLLÈGE SÉVIGNÉ :

- 1. Help each student develop his or her personality and blossom as part of a group
- 2. A humanist approach to teaching, open to cultural differences
- 3. Open up to the world of today and tomorrow in a spirit of innovation
- 4. Place cooperation at the heart of the educational community.

The primary school welcomes bilingual and French-speaking pupils who want to acquire very solid English language skills.

The aims of bilingual and bicultural teaching:

- maintain a high level of French
- English language immersion
- develop command of the English language (oral and written)
- ensure knowledge of French and English culture and literature through teaching provided by qualified native speakers.

Collège Sévigné, a private school under contract with the French Ministry of Education, aims to follow the French national curriculum in both languages, while promoting bicultural openness through complementary and innovative educational approaches.

Starting in Moyenne Section de Maternelle, pupils are taught 50% French and 50% English. In Petite Section, English is taught for 25% of the time, i.e. two mornings.

All skills and subjects will be taught in both languages throughout the cycle. English language teaching needs groups will be set up for two hours a week from CP onwards

Teaching is divided into half-day sessions, alternating between specific classrooms according to the language of instruction.

Cycle 1: Petite Section, Moyenne Section, Grande Section

Nursery school: a single cycle, fundamental to the success of all children
